

## **Vice Chancellor, University of Ladakh maiden visit to Government Degree College Nobra.**

Nubra, March 15, 2025: Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, University of Ladakh, Prof. (Dr.) Saket Kushwaha accompanied by Registrar, University of Ladakh, Nawang Tundup paid a maiden visit to Government Degree College Nobra on 15th March 2025.
